














OUR MISSION


To protect and restore Canada's natural environment and biodiversity through land conservation.

- To Date: Funded 13 land trusts/conservancies with the acquisition of 40 properties across Canada for a total of 13,000 hectares






LAND TRUST AND CONSERVANCY PARTNERS
